The HRH Scholarship program, administered by the VFIC, is provided to juniors who have academic promise and an interest in enhancing their future career opportunities in finance through an internship with HRH. The award is available to VFIC undergraduate students seeking degrees in Marketing, Business, Economics, Finance, Mathematics or related fields. Each scholar receives \$2,500 for his or her junior year and an additional \$2,500 for his or her senior year, contingent on maintaining the scholarship requirements. The scholarship process is very competitive and students selected have an inside track to apply for a paid summer internship at HRH.
